

1: Perspective – Remo has a birds-eye-view of an event showing tables and chairs. When people enter the event, they will start by having a small circle filled with either a person's picture or initial. This will serve as the person's marker, so while everyone moves around during the event, you can still tell who is who based on this marker. People attending an event will look down onto the platform from a birds-eye view, so you can see the whole area and immerse yourself in the event.



2: Tables – Remo allows people to experience a tableside talk while virtual. The table model allows for more intimate and focused conversations all the while providing plenty of space for all the participants. When you enter, all you have to do is click on a table and start talking. To switch to a different table and conversation, just double click the table you want to move to, it's that simple!


3: Communication – In addition to the live video communication at each table and the presentation mode, Remo offers multiple other ways for delegates to communicate with each other. You can use the interactive “Whiteboard”, which allows you to sketch, diagram, upload videos, press post-its, and more. You can chat on three different levels group chats for the whole event, individual table chat, and direct messages. Explore the different views by clicking Tile View/Back to floor.

4: How to Register for a Remo Event?


- If you have the event URL you can directly click on that link to go to the registration page.
- Click **'Save me a spot'** to register for the event (this can be done before the event starts)
- If you **have** attended a Remo event before, you will then be asked to **register** for the event using an email address or quick register with Google



If you **have not** attended a Remo event before, you will be asked to **create** an account first. To do this, just input your *email, name, password* and click **'Register event'**



- The **'Save me a spot'** button should then become greyed out with a message saying *'You have already registered for this even'* as shown:
- 15 minutes before the scheduled event, you should receive an email with the link to the event space. Click the **'Click here to access the event'** button
- If you did not receive this reminder email, just use the original link to the registration page
- You will be directed to the event’s landing page. Click the **'Join event now!'** button (this will only show once the countdown reaches 0)
- If the countdown is 00:00:00, but the “Join event now!” button still doesn’t show try refreshing the page



5: Checklist before Attending a Remo Event

Follow this checklist and get your computer Remo ready

a) Browser and Operating System (OS) Compatibility:

As Remo uses the latest video technology, please make sure your **browser** and **operating system (OS)** is updated to the **latest version**. Please check that you are using a **compatible browser** and operating system (OS) that fulfils the versions listed in the table below

Remo currently only support **Chrome**, **Safari**, or **Firefox** browser on your **desktop/laptop computer**. Mobile view can be accessed but it is in beta mode. It has reduced functionality (for example you cannot share your screen or use the whiteboard).

Before the event, please check that your microphone and camera works and that your browser, hardware and internet connection fulfils Remo's requirements on this [test page](#).

b) Microphone and Camera:

To get the full networking experience use a computer with a **camera** and **microphone**. It's not required but will let you have a complete experience. If your camera or microphone does not work here are some troubleshooting guides to help you resolve common issues:

6: How to Connect with Guests during a Remo Event

There are a number of ways you can connect with people during a Remo event:

- Switch your mic on
- Switch your camera on



- Chat with others. You can choose to chat using...
 - General Chat:** All guests in the event
 - Table Chat:** Those guests only at your current table
 - Private Message:** 1:1 direct message with another guest

- Connect with guests on LinkedIn or Facebook
- Book/schedule a meeting with another guest. When arranging a meeting Remo, it works best with [Calendly](#), a free online appointment scheduling tool

To do any of these things, all you need to do is click a guest's profile image and their profile ('virtual business card') will appear



7: How to Fill in your User Profile

You can add to different fields on your Remo business card, including LinkedIn, to share more information about yourself, which can help other delegates get to know you better and can lead to more meaningful conversations.

To start filling in your profile:


- Click on your image/image icon in the right-hand corner
- From the drop-down menu select '**My Profile**'



Once on your profile page, click the **'Edit Profile'** button

To edit your profile you can:

- Add your Full Name
 - Add a Profile Picture
 - Add a Headline and your Job Title
 - Add a URL to schedule meetings, e.g. a [Calendly](#) link
 - Connect to your LinkedIn or Facebook Profiles
 - Add a link to your Website
- c) Once you've filled everything you want, make sure to click **'Save Changes'** at the bottom of the page





8: How can I Distinguish Event Hosts or Speakers during an Event?

To help you distinguish specific guests easily during an event, there are special icons to their profile picture:

Event Hosts have a *star icon* next to their profile picture as shown below

Speakers have a *microphone icon* next to their profile picture as shown below

This helps you easily identify them from the other guests in the event.



9: How can I find myself at a Remo Event?

If you can't find your avatar on the event screen there's a handy feature that'll help you easily locate where you are, as well as zoom in and out of the event floor plan.

Here's how you can find yourself:

- a) Click the 'Where am I' locator button on the bottom-left of your screen
Your screen will immediately zoom in to where you are and your avatar will start blinking
- b) You can also zoom out or zoom in just by hovering over the 'Where am I' locator button and clicking the '-' or '+' buttons respectively

10: Using a VPN to Access Remo

Generally, Remo does not recommend users access Remo via Virtual Private Network (VPN) because their video streaming host provider does not work well with VPNs. However, if you have to use a VPN to access Remo, please visit this help article to get started:
